

## Audubon International Green Neighborhoods

The Green Neighborhoods Program engages community groups in projects that protect and enhance the land, water, wildlife, and other natural resources around them. It is not a certification program like the Sustainable Communities Program and is designed to be a better fit for communities with fewer resources.



Green Neighborhoods members make a commitment to complete at least one environmental improvement project each year and report their results. Projects are selected from five environmental tracks: wildlife, water, outreach and education, resource management, and community awareness. Members receive the Neighborhood for Nature by completing a project in each of the five tracks. Currently, Green Neighborhoods members are planting gardens for wildlife, cleaning up streams, and recycling.

The benefits of the program are numerous, including the creation of a sense of community within your group; enhancement of natural areas for neighborhood residents and wildlife; and the conservation and protection of local resources.
