Monitoring Instructions

You will be notified by the designated golf course Raptor Program point person when a bird has been released at the course. The monitoring schedule is as follows:

Weeks One and Two: Daily monitoring is required for the first week after a release and is strongly encouraged for the second week. Monitoring should occur at least three times in the second week.

Weeks Three and Four: Monitoring should occur at least once a week.
